The Bonds shall contain such other terms and conditions as are specified in the Notice of Sale, approved in Section 6 hereof (the "Notice of Sale"), and in the form of the Bonds, approved in Section 13 hereof.

Section 5. Redemption. (A) The Bonds of each series maturing prior to September 15, 2028 are not subject to redemption prior to their stated maturity. The Bonds of each series maturing on or after September 15, 2028 are subject to redemption, at the option of the Borough, prior to their stated maturity and upon notice as hereinafter provided, at any time on or after September 15, 2027, in whole or part from such maturities as the Borough shall determine and by lot within a single maturity, at the redemption price of 100% of the principal amount to be redeemed together with unpaid interest accrued to the redemption date.

(B) Any Bond subject to redemption as aforesaid may be called in part, provided that the portion not called for redemption shall be in the principal amount of \$1,000 or more. If less than all of the Bonds of a particular series and maturity are to be redeemed, Bonds of that series and maturity shall be selected by the Chief Financial Officer (or, if appointed pursuant to Section 15 hereof, the Paying Agent) by lot.

When any Bonds are to be redeemed, the Chief Financial Officer (or, if appointed by Section 15 hereof, the Paying Agent) shall give notice of the redemption of the Bonds by mailing by first class mail in a sealed envelope with postage prepaid to the registered owners of any Bonds or portions thereof which are to be redeemed not less than thirty (30) days, nor more than sixty (60) days prior to the date fixed for redemption. Such mailing shall be to the owners of such Bonds at their respective addresses as they last appear on the registration books of the Borough. Notice of redemption having been given as aforesaid, the Bonds, or portions thereof so to be redeemed, shall, on the date fixed for redemption, become due and payable at the redemption price specified therein plus accrued interest to the redemption date and, upon presentation and surrender thereof at the place specified in such notice, such Bonds, or portions thereof, shall be paid at the redemption price, plus accrued interest to the redemption date. On and after the redemption date (unless the Borough shall default in the payment of the redemption price and accrued interest), such Bonds shall no longer be considered as outstanding.

During any period in which The Depository Trust Company (or any successor thereto) shall act as securities depository for the Bonds of any series, the notices referred to above shall be given only to such depository and not to the beneficial owners of the Bonds of such series. Any failure of such depository to advise any of its participants or any failure of any participant to notify any beneficial owner of any notice of redemption shall not affect the validity of the redemption proceedings.

- **Section 6.** <u>Approval of Notice of Sale</u>. The Notice of Sale containing other terms and provisions of the Bonds and setting forth the conditions of the sale thereof, all of which are hereby approved, shall be substantially in the form attached to this Resolution as <u>Appendix B</u> and made a part hereof.
- **Section 7.** Approval of Summary Notice of Sale. The Summary Notice of Sale containing other terms and provisions of the Bonds and setting forth the conditions of the sale thereof, all of which are hereby approved, shall be substantially in the form attached to this Resolution as Appendix C made a part hereof.
- Section 8. Publication of Notice of Sale and Summary Notice of Sale. The Notice of Sale substantially in the form attached to this Resolution shall be published at least once in The Asbury Park Press, a newspaper circulating in the Borough, and the Summary Notice of Sale substantially in the form attached to this Resolution shall be published at least once in The Bond Buyer, and/or such other nationally recognized local government bond marketing publication or electronic information service carrying municipal bond notices and devoted primarily to the subject of state and municipal bonds. The advertisement of said Notice of Sale and Summary Notice of Sale in each such medium shall be published not less than seven (7) days prior to the sale date for the Bonds. The Borough Clerk, the Chief Financial Officer and such other appropriate officials are hereby authorized and directed to publish the Notice of Sale and Summary Notice of Sale as aforesaid.
- Section 9. Designation of Chief Financial Officer to Award Bonds. Electronic proposals for the purchase of the Bonds shall be received by the Chief Financial Officer on such date as shall be determined by the Chief Financial Officer and set forth in the Notice of Sale and the Summary Notice of Sale, or such later date as may be established by the Chief Financial Officer in accordance with Section 11 hereof. Electronic proposals will be received through the "PARITY Electronic Bid System" (PARITY) in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Notice of Sale authorized herein. Such proposals shall be received and announced in accordance with the Notice of Sale authorized herein. The Borough Council hereby designates the Chief Financial Officer to sell and award the Bonds in accordance with this Resolution and the Notice of Sale. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report, in writing, to the Borough at its first meeting after the sale of the Bonds as to the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the Bonds sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- Section 10. Adjustment to Maturity Schedule. The Borough may and expects to, after the receipt and opening of bids, adjust the maturity schedule of each series of the Bonds, provided however, that (i) no maturity schedule adjustment shall exceed 10% upward or downward of the principal for any maturity as specified herein, and (ii) the aggregate adjustment to the maturity schedule shall not exceed 10% upward or downward of the aggregate principal amount of bonds as specified herein and as adjusted will not exceed the amount authorized by the Ordinances. The dollar amount bid by the successful bidder shall be adjusted to reflect any adjustments in the aggregate principal amount of bonds to be issued. The adjusted bid price will reflect changes in the dollar amount of the underwriter's discount and the original issue premium or discount, but will not change the per bond underwriter's discount as calculated from the bid and the Initial Public Offering Prices required to be delivered to the Borough as stated herein. The Borough shall notify the successful bidder of the final maturity schedule and the resulting adjusted purchase price no later than 5:00 p.m., New Jersey time, on the day of the sale and award of the Bonds. The interest rate or rates specified by the successful bidder for each maturity will not be altered.
- Section 11. Postponement of Sale. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby delegated the authority (if the Chief Financial Officer deems it to be in the best interests of the Borough) (i) to postpone from time to time the sale of the Bonds from the date specified in the Notice of Sale (or, in the case of a rescheduled sale, from such rescheduled date), in each case upon not less than 24 hours' notice (to the extent practicable), and (ii) to reschedule such sale upon not less than 48 hours' notice. Notice of any such postponement and rescheduling shall be given in the manner specified in the Notice of Sale. In the event of any such postponement and rescheduling, the Chief Financial Officer may (and shall, if required by the Local Bond Law) cause a revised Notice of Sale and a revised Summary Notice of Sale to be prepared and published.
- Section 12. Authorization for Official Statement. The proper Borough officials and advisors are hereby authorized to prepare and distribute to the prospective purchasers (including through internet web posting or other electronic dissemination) of the Bonds a Preliminary Official Statement and a final Official Statement containing information relating to the Borough, its financial condition and the terms of the Bonds and other material facts customarily included in official statements for general obligation bonds in the State of New Jersey. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to deem final the Preliminary Official Statement for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission.
- **Section 13.** Approval of Form of Bonds. The form of the Bonds, substantially as set forth in Appendix D attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby approved. The Bonds shall be executed in the name of the Borough by the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer and the seal of the Borough, or a facsimile impression thereof, shall be affixed to the Bonds and attested by the manual signature of the Borough Clerk.

Section 14. Appointment of Securities Depository. The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), shall act as securities depository for the Bonds. The ownership of one fully registered bond for each maturity of each series of Bonds, each in the aggregate principal amount of such maturity, will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for DTC.

Pursuant to the book-entry only system, any person for whom a DTC Participant acquires an interest in the Bonds (the "Beneficial Owner") will not receive certificated Bonds and will not be the registered owner thereof. Ownership interests in the Bonds may be purchased by or through DTC Participants. Each DTC Participant will receive a credit balance in the records of DTC in the amount of such DTC Participant's interest in the Bonds, which will be confirmed in accordance with DTC's standard procedures. Receipt by the Beneficial Owners (through any DTC Participant) of timely payment of principal, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, is subject to DTC making such payment to DTC Participants and such DTC Participants making payment to Beneficial Owners. Neither the Borough nor the Paying Agent will have any direct responsibility or obligation to such DTC Participants or the persons for whom they act as nominees for any failure of DTC to act or make any payment with respect to the Bonds.

The appropriate officers of the Borough are hereby authorized to execute a Letter of Representation to DTC and such other documents as may be necessary or desirable in connection with DTC's services as securities depository.

DTC may determine to discontinue providing its services with respect to the Bonds of any series at any time by giving notice to the Borough and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto under applicable law. Under such circumstances, the Borough shall designate a successor securities depository or deliver certificates to the beneficial owners of the Bonds.

Section 15. Appointment of Paying Agent and Bond Registrar. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby delegated the authority to appoint any bank, trust company or national banking association having the power to accept and administer trusts to serve as Paying Agent and Bond Registrar for the Bonds. The Paying Agent and Bond Registrar shall signify its acceptance of the duties imposed upon it by this Resolution by a written certificate delivered to the Borough prior to the delivery of the Bonds.

Section 16. Pledge of Borough. The full faith and credit of the Borough is hereby pledged for the payment of the principal, redemption premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds. The Bonds shall be direct obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 17. Continuing Disclosure. The form of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate in substantially the form attached hereto as Appendix E is hereby approved, and the execution of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized. The Borough hereby covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate executed by the Borough and dated the date of issuance and delivery of the Bonds, as originally executed and as it may be amended from time to time in accordance with the terms thereof. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution, failure of the Borough to comply with the Continuing Disclosure Certificate shall not be considered a default on the Bonds; however, any Bondholder may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking specific performance by court order, to cause the Borough to comply with its obligations under this Section.

Section 18. <u>Further Action</u>. The proper officers of the Borough are hereby authorized and directed to take all such action as may be necessary to affect the issuance and delivery of the Bonds.

Section 19. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Construction: 18 permits and 4 permit updates processed. The type of work was 15 for alteration/renovations, 2 addition/rehabs, 2 new buildings, 1 addition and 2 demolitions. The total revenue was \$11,891.00.

Long Beach Island Health: There are monthly blood pressure screenings held throughout LBI. There are adult vaccines available for pneumonia, shingles and tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis. The flu clinics will be held on September 21, September 25 and October 5.

Office of Emergency Management: There will be a practice exercise on August 29th in the Borough Hall.

Water/Sewer: Councilman Robert Butkus

For the month of July, we pumped 20,720.000 gallons of water. We did 41 mark outs. We inspected and operated the plant and wells, helped with water meter reads and repairs and made all repairs to the water & sewer systems as needed. We collected \$10,067.24 in water payments and \$14,043.57 in sewer payments for a total of \$24,110.81. We did receive a few complaints about shingles blowing off of the sewer plant building. That is being taken care of.

Public Works: Councilman Peter Rossi

- 1. Maintenance and repairs done on all borough vehicles and equipment.
- 2. Metal, TV and brush picked up.
- 3. Ocean and Bay Beaches entrances shoveled and swept. All handicapped entrances cleared several times as needed. Ocean beach raked and Bay beach back bladed, trash and recycle emptied daily.
- 4. Grass cutting, weeding and spraying throughout the borough.

- 5. Filled potholes through the borough. Filled a washout at the boat ramp, at the end of Ship Bottom Ave. and at the handicap ramp at the bay beach, replaced flapper valve and repaired faucet. Filled a huge washout at the end of 24th St. bayside.
- 6. Repaired leaking shut off valve on 15th and Barnegat Ave.(cover)
- 7. Hole filled along curb on Barnegat Ave.
- 8. New flow valve replaced at restrooms at the boat ramp.
- 9. 21 yards of R-Blend picked up from county.
- 10. Cleaned the storm drains on 27th St. and checked flapper valve. (very little sand in drains)
- 11. Repaired back door of police dept.
- 12. Handicap mats on 15th and 20th streets swept.
- 13. Repaired fence on the pickle-ball court. It was reported kids were riding their bikes on the courts and into the fence.
- 14. Concert signs changed. New WIFI sign was put up in front of the Borough Hall.
- 15. New stop signs were ordered for Shore Ave. (requested by PD) New lines also painted.
- 16. Fire extinguishers inspected throughout the borough.
- 17. No Parking painted in front of beach entrances on Bay Terrace and 13th St.
- 18. Removed life guard stands from ocean on several streets, on-going problem.
- 19. Seaweed has been a problem, removed daily.

On a motion by Councilman English, seconded by Councilman Butkus, and all in favor vote, all aye, Mayor Huelsenbeck opened the meeting to the public.

- 1. Walter Arosemowicz, 2203 Bay Terrace, had comments regarding the borough reassessment, recent tax bills and school taxes.
- 2. Rick McDonough, 265 W. 13th St., is a member of the Southern Regional School Board and had comments regarding school taxes throughout the state, choice students and funding for the SRSD.
- 3. Joanne Carrol, 16th St., had comments regarding the traffic and parking in this immediate area. These were the same concerns that she voiced at last month's meeting. She submitted a petition with 108 signatures thanking the borough for investigating this issue and reiterating the need for change.

On a motion by Councilman English, seconded by Councilman Butkus, and all in favor vote, all aye, Mayor Huelsenbeck closed the meeting to the public.

On a motion by Councilman Rossi, seconded by Councilman Valyo, and all in favor vote, all aye, Mayor Huelsenbeck adjourned the meeting at 7:25 pm.
