RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT WITH MARK A. PINO AS ADMINISTRATOR

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing body to have an Employment Agreement with Mark A. Pino.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of Ship Bottom, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey as follows:

RESOLUTION 2016-168 RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ROUTE 72 MANAHAWKIN BAY BRIDGES PROJECT, SUPPORTING THE ELIMINATION OF A PUMP STATION BY THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) is proposing traffic and drainage improvements along the 8th and 9th Street corridors within the Borough of Ship Bottom as part of the Route 72 Manahawkin Bay Bridges Project; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT has recognized drainage problems along the 8th and 9th Street corridors within the Borough of Ship Bottom which will be alleviated as a result of these improvements; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT had initially proposed to install a pump station as part of these drainage improvements along the 8th and 9th street corridors; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT has subsequently determined that the proposed drainage improvements can provide an equivalent level of flooding relief without requiring installation and operation of a pump station; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT is asking for the support of the Borough of Ship Bottom for the elimination of the pump station.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ship Bottom, that we support the New Jersey Department of Transportation's proposed traffic and drainage improvements to the 8th and 9th Street corridors within the Borough of Ship Bottom Route 72 Manahawkin Bay Bridges Project and the elimination of the proposed pump station.

Mayor Huelsenbeck called for Resolution 2016-169: In support of S-2663 and A-4234, JIF investments. On a motion by Councilman Tallon, seconded by Councilman Rossi, this was approved as follows:

RESOLUTION 2016-169 RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, IN SUPPORT OF S-2663 and A-4234

WHEREAS, Almost all local units of government and Boards of Education in New Jersey including the Borough of Ship Bottom secure insurance through governmental entities known as joint insurance funds (hereinafter JIFs); and

WHEREAS, Existing law limits JIFs to investments otherwise authorized for local governmental entities and Boards of Education; and

WHEREAS, Insurance mechanisms such as JIFs have different cash flow needs than local government and Boards of Education; and

WHEREAS, Existing law greatly limits the potential investment earnings, currently less than 1% on investments of approximately \$1 billion; and

WHEREAS, S-2663 and A-4234 would permit JIFs to invest in debt obligations of any governmental entity established under the laws of the State of New Jersey and federal agencies or governmental corporations; and

WHEREAS, While the range of investments permitted by S-2663 and A-4234 is still very conservative, it would save the taxpayers at least \$10 million per year; and

WHEREAS, S-2663 and A-4234 would also reduce interest expense for local units of government and Boards of Education by creating an additional purchaser of their bonds; and

WHEREAS, S-2663 and A-4234 would also permit JIFs to join together and create a joint investment and cash management program further increasing investment income.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough of Ship Bottom that: 1.

- Legislature is urged to adopt S-2663 and A-4234 and
- 2. A copy of this resolution shall be sent to Senator Connors, Assemblywoman Gove and Assemblyman Rumpf, as well as the Governor, Commissioner of the Department of Banking and Insurance and the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs.
