RESOLUTION 2014-172 RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING REIMBURSEMENT OF A PORTION OF HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUMS TO VARIOUS EMPLOYEES FOR WAIVING HEALTH BENEFITS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 2, SECTION 2.08.030 OF THE BOROUGH CODE

WHEREAS, Section 2.08.030 of Chapter 2 of the Municipal Code of the Borough of Ship Bottomprovides that any employee eligible for the Borough's health benefits plan who is also eligible for coverage under another Health Care plan may waive Health Care coverage of all or part of the Borough's plans; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Code further provides that any employee waiving health benefits pursuant to the provisions therein, will be paid by the Borough a sum equal to fifty (50%) percent of the amount saved by the Borough because of the employee's waiver of coverage or an amount not to exceed \$5,000. for new employees; and

WHEREAS, various employees have filed a waiver of health benefits coverage with the Borough Administrator in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Code.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of Ship Bottom, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. That the governing body does hereby authorize the reimbursement of a portion of the health benefit insurance premium as set forth in Schedule "A" which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 2. That the amount of the reimbursement as set forth in Schedule "A" represents Fifty (50%) percent of the savings to the Borough of the waived health benefit coverage for period of January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014.
- 3. That a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough of Ship Bottom.

ORDINANCE 2014-12 AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2014-11 OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM INTRODUCED SEPTEMBER 23, 2014, PROVIDING FOR REPAIRS TO PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE AND WEST 16TH STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM AND APPROPRIATING \$300,000. (INCLUDING A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$233,429. EXPECTED TO BE RECEIVED FROM THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION) THEREFOR AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$63,243. IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM TO FINANCE THE SAME

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) **AS FOLLOWS**:

Section A. Bond Ordinance No. 2014-11 of the Borough of Ship Bottom, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey introduced September 23, 2014 and finally adopted October 28, 2014 (the "Prior Ordinance") is hereby amended in full to read as follows:

Section 1. The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Ship Bottom, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof, there is hereby appropriated the sum of money therein stated as the appropriation made for the improvement or purpose, such sum amounting to \$300,000 (including a grant in the amount of \$233,429 expected to be received from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation, representing no change in the amount appropriated in the Prior Ordinance) and including the sum of \$3,328 (representing a \$9.00 decrease in said amount from the Prior Ordinance) as the down payment for the improvement or purpose required by the Local Bond Law. The down

payment has been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment or otherwise provided for hereunder, negotiable bonds or notes are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$63,243 (representing a \$180.00 decrease in said amount from the Prior Ordinance) pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuence of the bonds or notes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Section 3.

(a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for which the bonds or notes are to be issued is repairs to Pennsylvania Avenue and West 16th Street, located in the Borough, and including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time, at not less than par and accrued interest, at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

<u>Section 5.</u> The capital budget or temporary capital budget (as applicable) of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget or amended temporary capital budget (as applicable) and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the costs thereof have been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 10 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$63,243 (representing a decrease of \$180.00 in said amount from the Prior Ordinance) and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An amount not exceeding \$50,000 (representing no change from the Prior Ordinance) for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the improvement or purpose.

(e) The Borough reasonably expects to commence the acquisition and/or construction of the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the Borough further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof.

<u>Section 7</u>. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3 hereof (other than the grant in the total amount of \$233,429 expected to be received from the State of New Jersey, Department of Transportation which has been applied to direct payment of the cost of the improvement) shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough is hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

<u>Section 9</u>. The Borough hereby covenants to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the exclusion from gross income of interest on the bonds and notes authorized hereunder which are issued as tax-exempt bonds as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

<u>Section 10</u>. To the extent that any previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent herewith or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

Section B. This Ordinance amends Bond Ordinance No. 2014-11 of the Borough introduced on September 23, 2014 and finally adopted October 28, 2014. Any inconsistencies shall be resolved by reference to this amending ordinance. To the extent that any previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent herewith or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

<u>Section C</u>. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

The foregoing bond ordinance is hereby approved.

Revenue and Finance: Councilman David Hartman

The tax sale was held on November 12 at 10:30 AM in Council Chambers. There were 14 liens sold to outside buyers. By the end of the week there were six redeemed before certificates were issued.

The remaining certificates are being mailed out to the lienholders to be filed at the county until the time when they are redeemed or foreclosed on. The sale brought in \$58,694.10 principal, \$7922.97 interest and \$3147.53 in costs for a total of \$69,794.60 and delinquent tax, water and sewer for 2013. This will also enable the lienholders to pay any delinquent money owed the town for 2014 and add that to their lien.

I want to mention that Dawn Annarumma, deputy tax collector, has passed the first course of three necessary to sit for the state tax collectors exam. Over the next year or so we are hoping she will be able to complete the other two courses and sit for her final. I ask it noted that she received an excellent score of 97.5 on the first test. Congratulations Dawn!

Taxes collected so far for the month of November were \$1,683,114.00, of that \$1,620,929.00 was for 2014, \$56,714.00 was towards 2015, \$10,684.00 was for 2013 and \$2323.00 was for interest.

Miscellaneous revenue is this month so far, \$26,945.00, notables within that were: Tower lease rental of \$2185.00, planning board fees of \$1000.00 and municipal court fines and costs of \$20,283.00.

Public Safety: Councilman Tom Tallon

The public safety report for October 2014: There were 503 reported activities. There were 4,135 patrol vehicle miles. There were 133 building and business checks. There were also 128 traffic stops, 1 motor vehicle accident with injuries, 8 motor vehicle accidents without injuries and 3 DWI's.

Water/Sewer: Councilman Richard Sinopoli

For the month of October, we pumped 7,174,000 gallons of water. The department inspected, operated and made repairs to the water & sewer systems.

Buildings and Grounds: We are repairing windows in the Borough Hall and looking into options for the leaking roof.

LBI Health Department: Flu shots are available.

- 16. Men sent to borough hall several times to move items and bring paper supplies.
